Chief Complaint:

"I have chest pain radiating to the right side of my neck to the back of my shoulder blade" * 1 day.

History of Present Illness

MC is a reliable 66yo divorced, Puerto Rican female, with a significant past medical history of MI, DMA, hypertension, and arthritis, presents to ER, c/o chest pain radiating from her neck to the back of her shoulder blade for the past day. She states the pain came on gradually between 2:00-4:00 yesterday afternoon. The pt describes the pain as dull and pressure-filled, 5/10 with radiation only to the right side of her neck and back of shoulder blade. She states the pain is persistent and is not alleviated or worsened by anything. The pt admits to a myocardial infarction this past June ^{after a 4th stent was put in} and states this pain is similar but less pressure-filled. The only medication the pt has taken is tylenol given to her in the ER. Pt admits to a present low-grade fever and other always-present symptoms such as fatigue, night sweats and left pain numbness. Pt denies any nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, changes in appetite, recent changes in diet, exercise or medication, headache, dizziness, or dyspnea. Since MC felt a chest pain similar to MIS with her MI, her son drove her to the ER.
